Buyers’ choices driving FMCG firms to step up focus on quick commerce

TREND DRIVER: Online sale is led by the beauty and personal care segment, but shift is visible across categories

Fast-moving consumer Goods (FMCG) companies are increasingly launching products for quick commerce and e-commerce platforms as they shift gears to stay profitable and relevant in a world of instant customer gratification. This is especially true for the beauty and personal care (BPC) segments. Product makers are launching dedicated premium products for quick commerce channels. Kolkata-based Emami Ltd, whose product lineup includes Zandu, Boro Plus, Navratna, and Kesh King, retails 80 per cent of its products online. “Quick commerce remains a stra-

tegic growth channel, scaling up rapidly at nearly 3x year-on-year (y-o-y), further validating our omnichannel playbook,” the company said recently. Market leader Hindustan Unilever, which has a considerable offline presence, is also following the online strategy. “We are beginning to see the benefit of shifting our

portfolio to faster growth spaces in modern, e-commerce channels in more premium areas,” said Rohit Jawa, Former MD and CEO of Hindustan Unilever (HUL) in a recent analyst call. Several of its legacy products such as Pond’s, Lakme are doing well on online platforms. “It’s been a double-digit quarter for Pond’s again. We

have gained market share in e-commerce and modern trade in the most competitive of marketplaces,” Jawa added.

BUYERS GO Q-COMM

According to Kearney, India’s quick commerce grocery market will triple between 2024 and 2027, reaching ₹1.5–1.7 lakh crore, with growth extending to cities with populations over 5 lakh.

Consumers are embracing the model not just for the discounts, but for its speed, assortment, and convenience, qualities that are increasingly influencing everyday and impulse purchasing. The shift is visible across categories such as snacking, gifting, personal care, and household essentials, with

premiumisation also on the rise,” the report said.

Market leader in the face wash segment, Himalaya Wellness, which gets nearly 13 per cent of its overall sales from e-commerce, plans to introduce dedicated custom products on quick and e-commerce platforms. “In the last couple of years, the channel has grown faster. Quick commerce is largely prevalent in metro towns, urban consumers can spend more, and so, the premiumisation of our categories is happening a lot more in quick commerce. We plan to play not only in new brands, but sizes, flavours, and fragrances in quick commerce,” Rajesh Krishnamurthy, Business Director- CPD, Himalaya Wellness, told *businessline*.

Beverage Association pitches for 18% GST slab on aerated drinks

The Indian Beverage Association has urged the GST Council to reclassify aerated beverages as “food/merit” category and put them in 18 per cent GST slab.

Currently, aerated beverages are classified as ‘sin/demerit goods’, leading to 40 per cent taxation, which includes 28 per cent GST and 12 per cent compensation cess. It has also reiterated its demand of rationalising GST on fruit-based juices to 5 per cent from the current 12 per cent slab.

It added that lowering of tax rate to 18 per cent GST slab on aerated beverages

will improve affordability, spur demand, and unlock growth across the consumption economy. The benefits will pass on to the consumers and increase margins for distributors and retailers, it noted.

BIG INVESTMENTS

The industry body, which represents non-alcoholic beverage industry, pointed out that the sector has invested about ₹50,000 crore and plans an additional investment of about ₹85,000 crore investment reinforcing its commitment to initiatives of ‘Make in India’.

“Carbonated beverages are highly price-sensitive, with about 71 per cent of transactions at ₹20 or less,

and about 65 per cent of consumers belonging to lower socio-economic classes. With demand exhibiting high price elasticity, rationalising GST would help sustain affordability for mass-market consumers,” the industry body stated. Aerated beverages are sold across 60 lakh *kirana* stores and provides high retailer margins of 19-24 per cent. It has been one of the fastest growing categories in the food and beverage sector.

IBA added that the industry provides 7 lakh jobs particularly in semi-urban and rural areas, fuelling infrastructure creation and benefiting local economies and rationalising of GST slab will lead to creation of more jobs.

‘Centre to involve ICAO in height norms around airports’

The Centre will conduct a study led by international experts on the height restriction scenario around airports to accelerate urban development under the concept of ‘Aerotropolis’.

Speaking to *businessline*, on the sidelines of NAREDCO’s 17th National Convention, Union Civil Aviation Minister Ram Mohan Naidu said the government wants the international civil aviation body ICAO to play a central role in this study.

At present, height restrictions around airports pose a challenge for urbanisation in several metropolises, including Mumbai, Hyderabad and Kolkata.

ICAO TO STUDY

“If some countries are able to do it, then we should also

be able to do it,” Naidu said, citing the examples of New York, London, Hong Kong and Dubai, where high-rise construction exists in close proximity to airports without compromising safety standards.

Minister Naidu said the government is setting up a committee that will work closely with ICAO, but the primary responsibility of the study will rest with the international civil aviation body.

According to Minister Naidu, the scope of the study

will also touch upon technology upgrades and such a review is in line with the ‘Viksit Bharat’ vision.

“Sometimes there are very old systems that we are using. If we can upgrade them to the latest technology, that gives us a certain leverage,” he said. He emphasised that airports should not be viewed in isolation, but rather as economic hubs, such as ‘Aerotropolis’.

“Aerotropolis is a city which surrounds the airport... all different kinds of concepts come in,” he said, adding that the Centre may call on States to hold joint consultations to develop detailed plans.

While addressing the convention, Naidu announced that the government would make efforts to amplify real estate activities within close proximity to upcoming airports in order to ensure sectoral growth.

Spices exports from Mehsana down 3% to ₹3,995 cr in FY25

Cumin, Isabgol and fennel seeds were among the ₹3,995 crore worth of spice seeds that were exported from Mehsana in Gujarat during financial year 2024-25.

Of the total exports, 25 per cent of the spices was shipped to China and an additional 16 per cent to Bangladesh, figures shared by the Gujarat government stated.

The same year 10 per cent of the total exports were to the United Arab Emirates (UAE), 5 per cent to the US and an additional 4 per cent to Morocco.

Between February 15 and April 10, 2025, the Unjha APMC (Agricultural Produce Market Committee) in Meh-

sana district recorded 54,410 tonnes of cumini arrivals. These arrivals were 17.5 per cent more than the 46,313 tonnes of arrivals during the same period last year.

There are over 800 firms that are involved in the exports and trade of cumini and other spice seeds at Unjha. The exports of cumini and other spice seeds from Mehsana grew over 42 per cent from ₹2,904 crore (about \$361.67 million) in 2022-23

to ₹4,127 crore (\$498.95 million) during 2023-24.

However, the exports declined slightly by three per cent to ₹3,995 crore in 2024-25. Adverse weather conditions last year had impacted the cumini production and exports during FY25, said officials.

During last rabi season, cumini was sown on 4.76 lakh hectares which was 25 per cent more than the three-year sowing average of the state.

OUTLOOK BUOYANT

Similarly, fennel was sown in 57,000 hectares, while isabgol was sown in 27,000 hectares. According to the officials from the State agriculture department, a good monsoon this year will provide a fillip to the sowing area under spices.

Rupee recovers from record low to end flat

The rupee recovered from its record low to end unchanged on Monday, helped by likely intervention from the Reserve Bank of India towards the later part of the session, according to traders.

The rupee ended at 88.1950 to the US dollar, identical to Friday’s close.

The currency fell 0.7 per cent in August, its fourth consecutive monthly decline.

TESTING TIMES

The rupee plummeted to a fresh record low of 88.33 earlier in the day, reflecting mounting concerns over higher US tariffs on Indian goods and the broader economic implications for the South Asian country.

“Today being a US holiday

there was thin liquidity, thus flows had power to create unusual moves in the currency,” said Kunal Sodhani, Vice-President at Shinhan Bank India.

“Overall, rupee weakness may persist in order to maintain export competitiveness. For dollar/rupee, 87.94 now acts as an important support, which was earlier the all-time high, while 88.50 levels may be tested,” he added.

Kerala hotels witness demand pick up for Onam

Hotels and travel companies have seen a pick up in demand for travel to Kerala during the Onam week leading to a rise in occupancies and room rates.

Akshay Thusoo, Senior Vice President (commercial), Sarovar Hotels said that occupancies at their Kerala properties have risen to 65 per cent compared to 35 per cent last year. Average room rates have increased 12 per cent over last year with guests opting for culturally immersive stays, he added.

“We are seeing a very strong performance in Kerala in both occupancy and average daily rates. This is further boosted by MICE (meetings, incentives, conferences and exhibitions) business in the region during this period,” said a Hyatt Hotels spokesperson.

Last year there were no government-sponsored events during Onam as the State mourned the loss of lives in landslides in Wayanad district. This year celebrations are in full swing with the State tourism department organising events across districts as a part of a 10-day celebration.

WET BLANKET

However, the only dampener is persistent rain. “Tourism in Wayanad had come to a complete standstill after the landslide last July. There has been a pick up in demand. Overall the situation is better now but it is still not at the same level as 2022 or 2023 because of heavy rains,” said Soorajith Radhakrishnan, Secretary, Wayanad Tourism Organisation. Kerala received 56 lakh domestic and 2.74 lakh foreign tourists in the first quarter of CY 2025 an increase of 13 per cent and 9 per cent over the previous year, the State tourism department said. Domestic tourist arrivals exceeded pre-pandemic figures and although data of second quarter is yet to be quantified, it added.

STRONG COMEBACK

Alongside hosting *sadhya* (Onam feast) and cultural programmes, the hotels are curating festive hampers for corporates and families. Hyatt said there is double digit growth in festive hamper sales with a 15 per cent increase in price points. At Hyatt Regency in Thiruvananthapuram, *sadhya* bookings have increased 30 per cent over previous year.

According to Musafir.com, hotel occupancies at popular destinations such as Munnar, Thekkady and Alappuzha are at near peak levels
